President's Message - Karen Powers

Many concerning events are unfolding in this world at a frenzied pace. All are complicated issues, have a convoluted history and most involve globalists, a worldly group who intend to revise and manipulate our past, present and future understandings of law, language, religion and science. Their desired result: elimination of Judeo-Christian religious tenets, denial of sensibility and morality (moral relativism), and establishment of global dominance with a Marxist mindset. Water is now a commodity being dumped into the ocean, and shorted in the stock market by hedge fund managers, who stand to profit by a shortage of available water. One example is an investment fund which profits from US and CA water shortages offered through Harvard University, among others. Globalist and businessman Bill Gates is now the largest private owner of farmland in the USA. Saudi Arabia and China are also purchasing US farmland and water rights. Danger lurks when our basic necessities needed to live, food and water, fuel, are financialized on the stock market. Deprivation of any product will drive up prices and profits but destroy any opportunities for a healthy economy due to man-made shortages.

At the state level, we should try to eliminate one-party domination in California. Here are some suggestions:

- 1. Support local conservative candidates. (See SRWF website for details about local candidates.)
- 2. Attend public meetings: City Council meetings, County Board of Supervisor meetings, School Board meetings to try to influence decision-making outcomes. Join focus groups or online political groups that inform members of timely political issues and events.
- 3. Stay informed through involvement with local Republican groups: Solano Republican Women Federated (including CFRW and NFRW); Solano Republican Assembly and Solano County Republican Central Committee are three local examples.
- 4. Vote and also encourage Republicans, Independents and Conservatives to vote. Do not let fear or frustration impede your blood-born right to vote in our nation as a US citizen. Republican women remember, our right to vote came after doing battle for a constitutional amendment enshrining a women's right to vote in the USA.
- 5. Keep in prayer for the protection of your family and this nation. Despite our flaws, people from many nations still run toward the USA in search of a better way of life and freedom from the tyranny.

<u>AB-1631</u> – Election: Election Officials

Current law requires the Secretary of State to adopt uniform standards regarding the training of precinct board members, including languages that may be encountered by a poll worker during the course of an election. This bill would state the intent of the Legislature to enact legislation to require the usage of bilingual polling place workers at appropriate precincts given the language needs of the voters.

<u>AB-1771</u> – The California Housing Speculation Act: Income Taxes: Capital Gains: Sale or Exchange of Qualified Asset: Housing

This bill imposes a 25% tax on all net capital gains from the sale or exchange of homes or other property. It specifically targets short-term investors (tax house flippers and speculators) who buy homes and other properties, keep them for some time and sell them for a profit a short time later. While the tax may be reduced if significant time has passed, those who buy and sell property within three (3) years would need to pay the tax. The bill would take effect immediately as a tax levy for all taxable years beginning in 2023. All revenue would go to the Speculation Recapture Community Reinvestment Fund.

AB-1771 would result in a tax change, a 2/3 vote of each house would be needed to approve the bill. Since capital gains taxes are already collected under these circumstances, this seems like a duplicative tax.

AB-2229 – Peace Officers: Minimum Standards: Bias Evaluation

Existing law requires peace officers in this state to meet specified minimum standards, including, among other requirements, that peace officers be evaluated by a physician and surgeon or psychologist and found to be free from any physical, emotional, or mental condition that might adversely affect the exercise of the powers of a peace officer. This bill would require that evaluation to include bias against race or ethnicity, gender, religion, and sexual orientation in jeopardy of discrimination. This bill would declare that it is to take effect immediately as an urgency statute. This bill could place those with religious beliefs at a distinct disadvantage. Existing law requires the minimum education requirement is a high school graduation from a public school or other accredited high school, passing an equivalency test or high school proficiency examination or attaining a 2-year, 4-year or advanced degree from an accredited institution.

This bill would revise the accreditation standards to include an organization holding full membership in Cognia. This is a non-profit company that evaluates and determines accreditation.

<u>AB-1638</u> – Motor Vehicle Fuel Tax Law: Suspension of Tax

Existing law, the Motor Vehicle Fuel Tax Law, imposes a tax upon each gallon of motor vehicle fuel removed from a refinery or terminal rack in this state, entered into this state, or sold in this state, at a specified rate per gallon. This bill would suspend the imposition of the tax on motor vehicle fuels for 6 months. The bill would direct the Controller to transfer a specified amount from the General Fund to the Motor Vehicle Fuel Account in the Transportation Tax Fund. By transferring General Fund moneys to a continuously appropriated account, this bill would make an appropriation. This bill would declare that it is to take effect immediately as an urgency statute.

UPDATE: <u>AB-1599</u> - Proposition 47 Repeal

This bill would have lowered the threshold for grand theft, fraud, theft, and several other crimes. This bill was killed in the Public Safety Committee last week by the Democrats.

News from our March 7 Meeting



Our Speaker at the March Meeting was Rio Vista Mayor Ronald Kott held in Rio Vista at the Point Restaurant. Ron was elected to the City Council in November 2014. In 2016 he was appointed Vice Mayor and in November 2017, upon the passing of Mayor Norman Richardson, was appointed Mayor of Rio Vista. In addition to serving on various city committees and commissions, Ron also represents Rio Vista, serving on the boards of the Solano Transportation Agency, Solano County Water Authority, Yolo Solano Air Quality Board, the Delta Protection Commission and several other regional agencies.

Mayor Kott spoke about a number of issues and changes in Rio Vista including:

- 1. The Army base along the water purchased in 2003 for \$30K. The plan is to develop a fish research center. Money is needed from the state and federal governments to support this project.
- 2. Flood Wall

The town of Rio Vista originally resided about two miles up river. In 1862, the mighty Sacramento River rose and flooded and destroyed the town by 12 feet of water. The town relocated to its present location.

Currently, part of River Rd tends to flood during a wet winter and in conjunction with a hide tide.

The flood wall would be in case of the 200 year old flood.

3. Wastewater Treatment Plant

Recently, someone dumped toxic waste into the Beach St waste water treatment plant. It ruined the biomass and the sludge had to be disposed into the river.

This old treatment plant needs to be shut down and waste water pumped uphill to the new waste water treatment plan not far from the airport. Government money is needed to accomplish this.

4. The Royal Motel on Highway 12 is soon to open. The renovation has taken a few years and a new owner is coming soon. Once that happens, it will open and be ready for business.

5. A new wine/coffee bar will be opening on Main St soon.
